70 children aged 6 graduated from the Maasai kindergarten to start primary school in January 2012. The kindergarten built by ACT celebrates its 10th birthday in January 2012.

ACT provides educational materials for the kindergarten and pays the teachers' salaries. The kindergarten caters for 100 children every year. The children enjoy hot porridge every morning.

Hope and friends also donated money to buy text books and sports equipment for the primary school.
